Rosenberg thinks Toronto should take a cue from London, England, and introduce fees to drivers entering certain city boundaries during its busiest hours. 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"Those people get to come downtown and enjoy whatever we're doing, and they don't have to pay for it," Rosenberg said. "The people who live in the 905 end up enjoying it and appreciating it, so they should help support it."

To implement such a scheme, she adds, the city would have to spend more money on public transit first, giving drivers a viable alternative.
